

## Attendance Allowance (AA)

This is for those aged 65 and over to help with personal care because you are physically or mentally disabled.

This benefit is non-means tested and tax free. Getting AA can help you qualify for extra amounts of other means-tested benefits such as Pension Credit, Housing Benefit or Council Tax Reduction.

If you think that you might be entitled to claim AA please complete a 'Attendance Allowance Claim Form' – you can download this form at:

Then send your form and the required evidence to the address on the form. You may be called for an

assessment. If you do you will receive a letter requesting this.
